# **ANNUAL REPORT 2017**

Report of the Drakensberger Cattle Breeders Society and the Board's endeavours during 2016/17

#### INTRODUCTION

Politics in South Africa is a game played by a few rich families and politicians seem to benefit from this, while state departments are going technically bankrupt - the game continues, regardless. What a mess! We still have to make sense of it all, in the best interest of the future of our beautiful country.

2017 started on a positive note as far as rainfall is concerned, and forage is recovering well after the drought of 2015/16. Weaner prices skyrocketed - up to R34.00 per kg or R8 000.00 per calf is no longer far-fetched. Record mealie and soy been harvests are imminent and it is hoped that these record prices will also reflect in our auction prices.



#### **BOARD**

The board functions well and four board meetings were held - two in Parys, one in Bloemfontein and one in Vrede. Six teleconferences were held between members of the executive management and further matters were dealt with by means of e-mails, telephone and WhatsApp. The executive committee and board members spent many hours on the society's business. Willie Landman is vice president, manages the budget, serves on all the committees and is responsible for promotion of the breed together with Alda Fourie. He is also the board member for the eastern part of North West and Botswana. Rodney Neuman also serves on the executive committee, manages the sponsors and all payments done by the society. He is also responsible for the National Auction and Eastern Free State. Dr Johann Fourie serves on the executive committee, is the convener of the technical committee and responsible for research projects and the western part of North West and the Northern Cape. He is also a patron of the National Auction. Fanie van Dyk is the board member responsible for Nampo activities and spends the whole week there. His region is the Southern Free State and the Karoo. Pikkie Uys represents Mpumalanga and manages the annual selection course at Gryshoek. He is also a patron of the National Auction and is involved with genetic planning and the arrangement of selection tours. Henk Delport is the board member for Northern and Western Free State, is our Studbook representative and also involved with genetic planning. He also ensures that our Nampo exhibition area is clean and ready for action. Jean van der Merwe is board member for Gauteng and our man for technology. He is involved with our new website and the regular update thereof. Jean is active on Facebook and ensures that the world knows of events as they happen. Jean is also involved with the annual selection course, Nampo and the arrangements for the National Auction. Louis Botha is responsible for KwaZulu-Natal and is involved with the annual refresher course of the selection panel. He is also a patron of the National Auction. Dr Bobbie van der Westhuizen is the Studbook representative on the board. John Roos is honorary president of the Society.



#### SECRETARIAT AND ADMINISTRATION

Ronandé Wiese is our secretary and apart from all her tasks at the office, she attended all of our meetings and also attended Nampo. I would like to thank her for her hard work and positivity every day. Wilanna Coetzer very efficiently attends to all our enquiries at Studbook. The two ladies at the secretariat who deals with our finances are Eleanor de Jager (debtors) and Yvonne Binding (responsible for all payments and financial management). They are doing excellent work and we would like to thank them in this regard.

#### **FINANCES**

As is reflected in the financial statements, the funds are being managed meticulously. The budget is prepared and managed by Willie Landman. All payments are approved by Rodney Neuman. Debtors exceeding 120 days are problematic and we had to take action in this regard.

#### **TECHNICAL**

Dr Johann Fourie is the convener of the technical committee who had a meeting in Pretoria at the office of SA Studbook. Dr Japie van der Westhuizen, dr Bobbie van der Westhuizen, dr Johann Fourie, Magiel Blom, Eli van der Merwe and dr Frik Barnard were all present. Dr Bobbie van der Westhuizen will report in more detail. Two meetings (one in Parys and one in Vrede) were held regarding breeding value guidelines and composition of cow values with dr Bobbie van der Westhuizen and dr Helena Theron on behalf of Studbook, dr Johann Fourie, Willie Landman, Magiel Blom, Henk Delport and Pikkie Uys on behalf of the Board. Danie Bosman was also present and provided exceptional inputs. Frik Roux and Eli van der Merwe also participated. The composition of cow values was amended and was already indicated in the genetic report of March 2017. The breeding value guidelines have been compiled and there is enough room for variation within the breed. It is, however, important to remember that it is only a guideline and not a requirement.



#### **RESEARCH**

Various studies are in progress. At the University of Pretoria, prof Esté van Marle-Köster and dr Carina Visser are busy with studies regarding double skin (dermatosparaxis), double muscling, marbling, colour variation and white above the belly line. Roelin Grobler already progressed far with a study about the hornless gene with inputs by Derick Orsmond. At the University of the Free State, prof Frikkie Neser contributes to a study that analyses testes circumference/volume in young bulls in growth tests. The study is done by Adri O'Neill and will be of great value when completed. Liesel Foster obtained her PhD following a three year study on lick composition and the results of animal production. Ms Lené Pienaar of the ARC did a study on the composition of breeds.

# **BEEF GENOMICS PROGRAMME (BGP)**

Workshops were attended by dr Johann Fourie, Magiel Blom, Henk Delport, dr Liesel Foster and Derick Orsmond. Our breed's frame of reference will be done in the next year and a thousand profiles will be available.

#### **BREED PROMOTION**

Ms Alda Fourie was responsible for planning, coordinating and implementation of promotional activities, which included Veeplaas and Farmers Weekly packages and radio interviews. She also oversaw the Farmers Weekly supplement which was published in the first week of May 2017 - thank you to all the advertisers who made this supplement possible. Sponsors once again made a huge contribution to our breed promotion and here Alda and Rodney Neuman took the lead. The following activities took place:



# Nampo

Nampo offers a big marketing opportunity each year. Henk Delport and Pieter Esterhuizen is in charge of the exhibition and everything is clean and freshly painted, with new banners. Thank you to them both. Fanie van Dyk, Piet de Villiers and Ronandé Wiese were at their posts every day. Gawie and Frik Roux provided the bull, cow and calf for the inside exhibition. Willie Landman and Jean van der Merwe provided the cross-calves for the outside kraal. Henk had carry bags made to hand out and breeders who acted as sponsors were Delram, Rouvus, Black Hills, Black Fox, Mambane, Hymgert, Frelon and Cumin.

# Information days

- The Fox in the Hills information day was held on 2 July 2016 at Rooipoortjie, Potchefstroom and about 150 guests attended the day with Danie Bosman as speaker.

Both these herds are part of the top 10 herds over all breeds who do animal recording with Studbook. and Dr Hans Schütte (Hansel) and Bronze to Dr Johann Fourie (Black Fox), Kobus and Francois Weideman (Bloubosput), Jan Ehlers (Kwars), Johannes Retief (Nadau), Bezuidenhout Broers (Swartbult), Henk Delport (Delram), Eli van der Merwe (Blyde) and Dries van der Walt (Erfenis).

#### Youth shows

#### SELECTION AND SELECTION TRAINING

Carel Nel is our big induna when it comes to selection/grading. The new year was kicked off with a selection course at Gryshoek under auspices of Piet de Villiers. He is assisted by Pikkie Uys and Jean van der Merwe. Willie Watermeyer and Petrus Taljaard lent a hand with the practical segment. Eight out of 22 candidates passed the course. The selectors' refresher course was held in Vrede with a meeting and grouping for tours done by Pikkie Uys (six tours altogether with 25 selectors on tour). Danie Bosman leads the discussion and during the practical session at Neuman Broers, Carel Nel and Louis Botha also participate. The selectors drove 14 000 km on the annual selection tours and I wish to thank everyone for this mammoth task and the good ambassadors they are for the breed.
