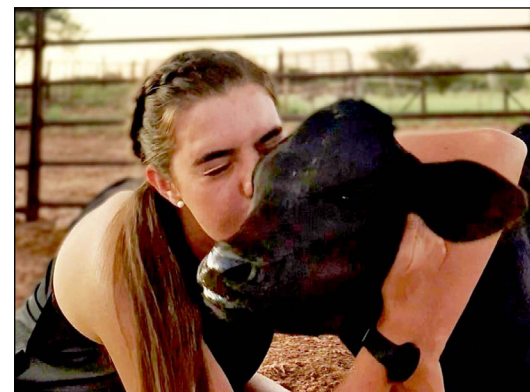

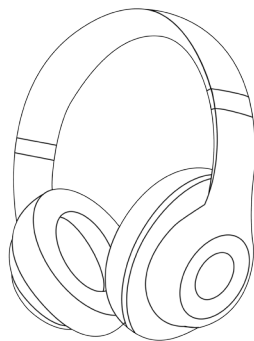

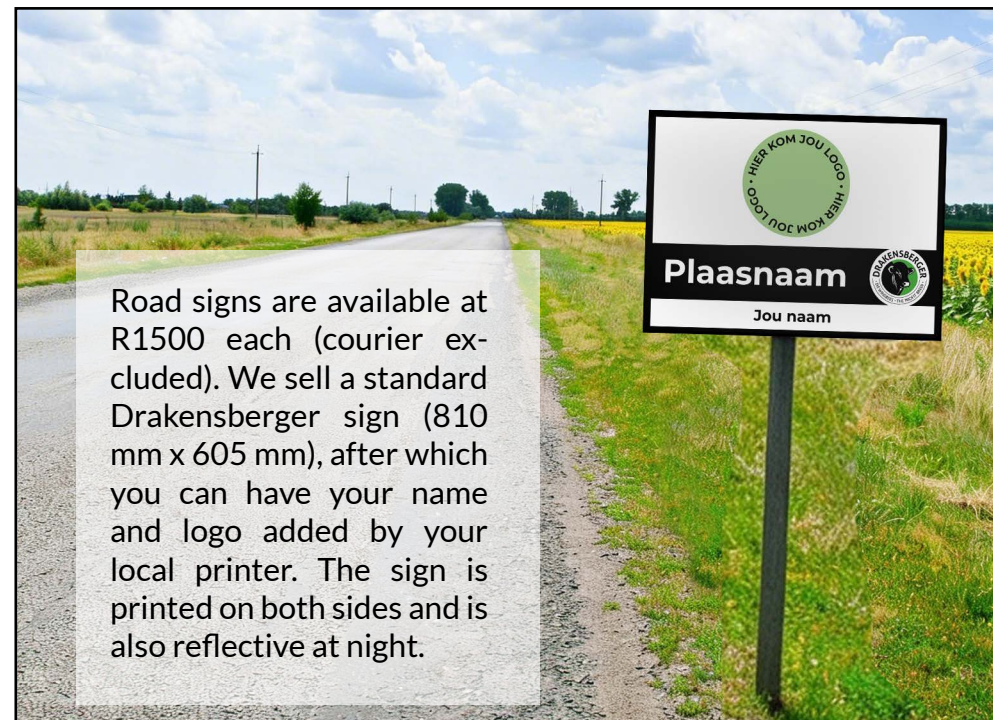
Lend me your EARS!

SA Stud Book Genomic Service for Beef Cattle

BGP2 funds for year 3 are approved and paid over by the funder.

For the third and final year of BGP2, the funder will subsidise genomic tests with R420-00.

SA Stud Book will subsidise an additional subsidy of R104-00 for SA Stud Book Breeders.

Therefore, the total costs to the Breeder will be R549-00 excl. VAT.

There are no deviations from the original BGP2 proposal as approved at the start of the 3-year project.

SA Stud Book is ready and awaits samples for year-3 of BGP2.



KING OF THE GRASMUNT CASTLE

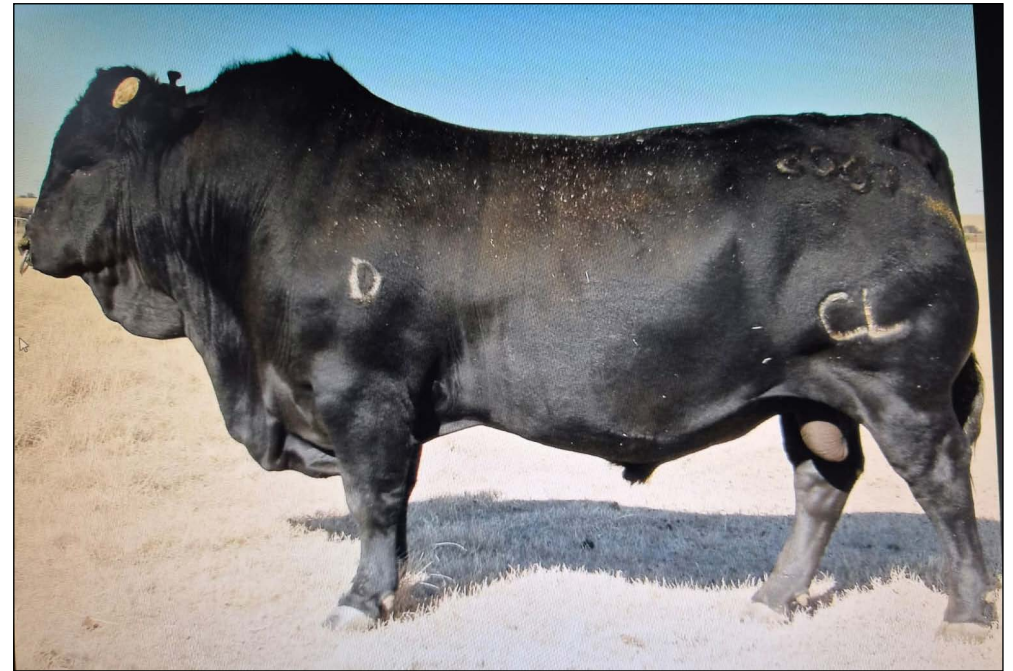
At the SHDK auction on 20 August 2026, a new record price of R575,000 was achieved for a Drakensberger. The winning bid was made by Johan Wessels.

The previous Drakensberger record was set 13 years ago, when HN090023 was sold for R345,000 at the Neuman Brothers auction.

Grasmunt Koning CL 2067

Two days after his birth, Stephan, my stockman, and I weighed him and tagged him. As he walked away, I remarked that a little “king” was walking away from us. Even as a calf, he simply carried himself with an air of superiority. Head held proudly as he looked at you, already displaying an exceptional conformation and perfect legs. His registered stud name was Grasmunt Mandaat 2, but from the very beginning he was ALWAYS referred to as Koning. Until recently, his name at SA Stud Book was still Mandaat 2 – until a fellow breeder asked me what had become of Koning and, following his suggestion, Mandaat 2 was replaced with Koning. Now everyone knows who Koning is.

Grasmunt Koning is absolutely the result of the planned combining of the best breeding material in my stud over many years. His mother and both grandmothers are Golden Cows, and if one goes even further back, the great-grandmothers had ICPs of 385 days over 8 calves and 395 days over 11 calves. Outstanding bulls such as CL 0448 Grasmunt Kok2, CL 0602 Grasmunt Bunker 2, CL 0954 Grasmunt Koper, CL 1624 Grasmunt Chappie and HN 0235 also formed part of a planned objective to breed



the ideal, or perfect, functional animal – one that can be fully defined within the Standard of Excellence of the Drakensberger breed.

But perhaps the most important characteristic of this bull is the fact that he passes all these good qualities on to his progeny with strong heritability. His calves are so easy to identify among the others because they display a specific, uniform phenotype. This uniformity, and what I consider to be the ideal frame size, is now being confirmed year after year in his



third generation of progeny in my herd. This is the result I have strived towards all these years, and what a great privilege it is to know that Kon-ing can now also make a positive contribution to other herds. My sincere thanks to Johan Wessels, who made sure that this greatest milestone in my and the Grasmunt Stud's existence became a reality.

None of this would ever have been possible without the help and guidance of my Heavenly Father. I see myself merely as the chief executive officer on this small piece of earth where I have the privilege of living and farming, and of caring for the animals entrusted to me for which I have accepted stewardship. What a gracious privilege, for which I am unspeakably grateful.

IDTrax User Guide

Registration to Ordering Vaccines

If you are a registered stud breeder, you can use the following steps to login on IDTrax via Logix. ALL animals that are registered on Logix will automatically be on IDTrax.

Information You May Need

- RMIS GLN (Production Unit Number)
- veterinarian GLN or name of the vet
- Driver, vehicle and trailer licenses (optional not compulsory)

Step 1: Open the Logix system

- Log in with the following:
 - » Logix username
 - » Logix password
- Click on the go to IDTrax button on the left hand side of the screen.
- You will then be directed to the IDTrax website.

Step 2: Add your farm/s

- A map screen will then pop up.
- Search for your nearest town or use GPS co-ordinates to redirect you to your production unit.
- By the search bar above the image of the map, if you are using GPS co-ordinates, click on the button "GPS Coords" which is on the left hand side next to the search bar, you will then have to insert your GPS coordinates (please note that the "-" in front of the GPS coordinates is the latitude).
- Click on "add farm"
- Select your portion.
- Insert your Farm name and GLN number.
- Click on save.
- Click on next step on the top right hand side of the screen.

Step 3: Allocating your animals

- The next pop up screen will be of all your animals registered on Logix.
- There is a white button / checkbox which allows you to select all your animals, if they are all on the same farm.
- If your animals are on different farms, you need to select them one for one.
- PLEASE NOTE AS IMPORTANT FOR VACCINE ORDERS: If you are urgently needing vaccine, you may allocate all the animals to one farm first and after you have placed your vaccine order for the animals, you can then allocate them to the different farms.
- Once you have selected all your animals, click on the Allocate selected animals button on the right hand side bottom corner.
- Click on next step.



Step 4: Nominate your veterinarian

- Once you have done the above and clicked on next, a screen will pop up to allow you to choose your veterinarian.
- You can search for your veterinarian via GLN number, practice name or province (dropdown).
- Select you vet.
- Click on the save button.
- Click on next step.
- Click on finish guide.

Step 5: Ordering your vaccines

- After you have finished the above step, this will automatically redirect you to the IDTrax dashboard/home screen.
- On the screen on the right hand side underneath, you will see the different categories:
 - » Administrative
 - » Animal
 - » Movement
 - » Herd Health
- Click on the herd health category: Vaccine Orders.
- Click on the + New Vaccine Order.
- Fill in the necessary information asked:
 - Disease: (FMD)
 - Vaccine / Treatment: This field is not necessary to fill in, it is an automated selection
 - Preferred vet: your nominated veterinarian will be available from the drop down list
 - Farm GLN: will be available from the drop down list
 - Quantity: Enter the max allowed to order beneath the quantity field (please note that the quantity allowed will be in yellow underneath the quantity field)
- Select the required vaccine, choose the quantity, review your cart, confirm delivery details and complete the checkout process.

Step 6: Tracking your vaccine order

- Monitor your order status from your account and review your order history when required (vaccine order)
- On the home/ dashboard screen on the right hand side underneath, you will see the different categories again:
- Click on the herd health category: Vaccine Orders to view your order history.

CORRECTIVE MATING: *The Genetic Gamble*

Corrective mating pairs an animal that's weak in a trait with one that excels in it, hoping the calf lands closer to the strong parent. It works well for traits you can see and select on directly in the first generation — like growth traits — because a calf that doesn't improve simply isn't used for further breeding.

But for milk in beef cattle, corrective mating is a gamble that can backfire.

Why milk is different

A bull's genes for milk only show up once his daughters have calves and start weaning them — often years after he has already been used widely as a breeding bull. A bull's own "average" milk breeding value doesn't necessarily mean both his parents were average for milk. It can mean one parent was excellent and the other poor, and the average is simply the midpoint. Many of the queries received by SA Stud Book involve bulls whose milk EBVs drop sharply between analyses, almost always because the early estimate was based mostly on the parents' average, and the truth only emerged once his daughters started weaning calves.

A real example

A six-year-old bull looked solid at his first evaluation: 84 weaned calves, a strong Weaning Weight EBVi of 135, and an average Milk EBVi of 101. That average came from a sire with an excellent Milk EBVi of 142 and a dam with a weak 75 — a classic corrective mating.

A year later, once 20 of his daughters had weaned their own calves, his Milk EBVi collapsed to 60 — because he had inherited more from his weaker-milk dam than his stronger-milk sire. The dam's own Milk EBVi even dropped further, from 75 to 55, confirming she truly did carry low genetic potential for milk. Meanwhile his Weaning Weight EBVi held steady, since that trait isn't sex-limited and was already backed by his own progeny data.

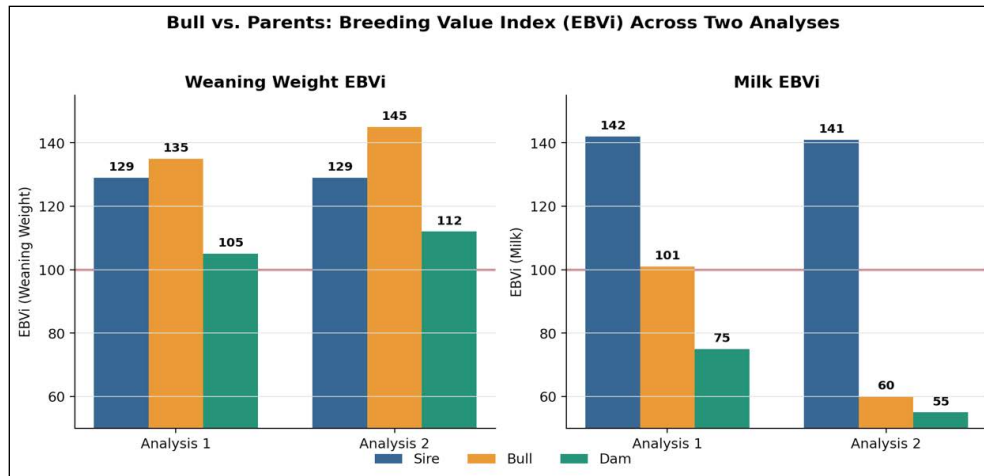


Figure 2: The bull's Milk EBVi fell sharply once daughter data arrived, while Weaning Weight stayed stable.

How do you spot a correctively-mated bull?

Check both parents' Milk EBVi. If the bull's own midparent value sits in the "average" range (90–110) but one parent is well below 90, he is likely a corrective-mating product and could easily inherit the weaker parent's milk potential. If both parents sit between 90 and 110, he isn't.

The bottom line

Corrective mating can genuinely help fix a single weakness in animals, and it isn't always a problem — some calves do inherit the better parent's genes. But using it to "average out" a poor milk parent in a breeding bull is high-risk, because:

- Bulls sire many more calves than cows produce, so any weakness spreads through a large part of a herd.
- Milk is sex-limited — the truth only emerges once daughters start weaning calves, often years and several calf crops later.
- By the time the truth is known, the herd may already be full of his daughters, pregnant cows and calves — with genetic progress stalled and many females unsuitable for herd improvement.

Recommendation: Only buy or breed replacement bulls from parents that are both genuinely strong for milk — not from a bull whose "average" figure may be hiding one weak parent. If you're prepared to take that gamble, at least know what you're buying.



RMIS Traceability Platform

Step-by-Step Registration Guide

This guide explains how to register a Production Unit on the RMIS Traceability Platform.

Step 1: Open the RMIS Website

- Go to the RMIS website
www.rmisa.co.za

Step 2: Register Your Profile

- Register with your cellphone number.
- Verify your account using the OTP sent to your cellphone via SMS.

Step 3: Identifying the location

- You will then see the “home / dashboard” screen and on this screen you will see an icon that says Identify Location.

Information Required Before You Start

- Cellphone number
- Farm name
- Farm location
- GPS location
- Livestock species

Information required when you want to log in again:

Use your registered cellphone number and verify your account using the OTP sent to your cellphone via SMS.

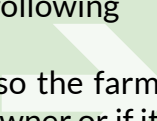
Step 4: Choose your production unit:

- Choose one of the following; if you have more than just one, you are welcome to click on the other options too.
- The following options are available:
 - » Communal Land
 - » Farm
 - » Feedlot
 - » Auctioneer agency
 - » Abattoir
 - » Processor
 - » Testing Station
 - » Veterinarian
- Click on the “next” button in the right hand side corner.
- A Screen will then pop up, to show you on how to select your production unit.

Step 5: Capture Your Farm Location

- On the map in the left hand side corner, insert your farm name or nearest town.
- Select the portion (this is the portion in which your production unit is in) and then click on next in the right hand side corner of the screen.
- Follow further instruction as on the screen, which will ask the following steps:
 - » Farm Boundaries is also the farm details (If you are the owner or if it is a rental production unit and also the name of the production unit in which the GLN number must be allocated to).



RMIS Traceability platform (continued)

- » Select Farm type/s (Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Poultry, Game, Dairy, Grain, Pigs, etc)
- » Contact information (Choose Individual or Company, First name, Last name, Tel nr., Email) and click on next in the right hand side corner of the screen.

Step 6: POPI Act Compliance

A pop-up screen will then appear and it will ask you for permission to agree to the terms and conditions.

Step 7: Receive Your GLN

Once approved, RMIS will allocate your Production Unit a Global Location Number (GLN) and this will be sent to you via Whatsapp.

Step 8: Using Your GLN

Use your GLN in compatible systems such as IDTrax for livestock traceability.



Who Does What on the Council?

President: Johann Fourie

Responsible for the Society's strategy throughout his term of office.

Vice-President: Willie Landman

Has the ability to take over the full responsibilities of president at any time. He is also currently a member of the executive committee, which consists of four council members who communicate through meetings five times a year to make necessary decisions that cannot necessarily wait until the next council meeting.

Financial management is handled by the person best suited to the task and is not linked to a particular title.

Marketing is also handled by Willie, together with other council members. Once again, responsibility is allocated to the person with the greatest expertise and dedication for a specific task. It is a task that requires commitment and passion; hours of planning and thought go into it.

Dr Liesel Foster

As a member of the executive committee, she carries greater responsibility regarding decision-making. She is also responsible for handling technical matters and serves as the liaison with individuals involved in research. Her knowledge and experience, as well as her connections with colleagues in the scientific community, are invaluable.

Henk Delpont

A member of the executive committee and involved in making the definitive decisions that fall within the committee's responsibilities. He is involved in marketing through regular meetings, ideas, planning and implementation.

It is important to have a contact person with SA Stud Book, and he distinguishes himself in many areas. He is also involved in all Society activ-



ities through his presence and participation. He is additionally involved in financial management.

JP Theunissen

Involved in financial decisions and serves as the person responsible for the Council's liaison with the Young Farmers' Members Group. He will be involved in organising Nampo Harvest Day 2027, which is a major showcase for the breed. Sponsors contribute significantly to the financial success of the Society, and the successful recruitment of sponsorships is handled by him.

Udo Beneke

Responsible for the organisation of the selectors' system, which includes selectors, selection tours, special selections and practical training.

Jean van der Merwe

Responsible for managing and overseeing the running and flow of office matters.

He is also the primary person responsible for the National Auction and all activities related to it. This includes planning the venue, auction house, accommodation, menus... you name it, he coordinates it. He is

also involved in the two weekly marketing meetings, with the benefit of the breed as the primary objective.

Willie Watermeyer

Responsible for selecting the bull that will represent the breed at the Performance Class Championships in 2027. He is also responsible for presenting selectors' training (junior and senior) during 2027. He forms part of the decision-making regarding the animals representing the breed at Nampo.

Pikkie Uys

The selection of animals for the National Auction, which serves as an advertisement for the breed, is considered very important. As part of the planning for the coming year, a seminar has been planned covering multiple interesting and relevant topics. He will play a major role in this. He is also involved in providing ongoing guidance and advice to breeders and interested parties.

These are the core responsibilities allocated to the respective council members. In principle, all council members are expected to remain continuously aware of Drakensberger activities in their respective areas and, at all times, to protect the interests of the breed.

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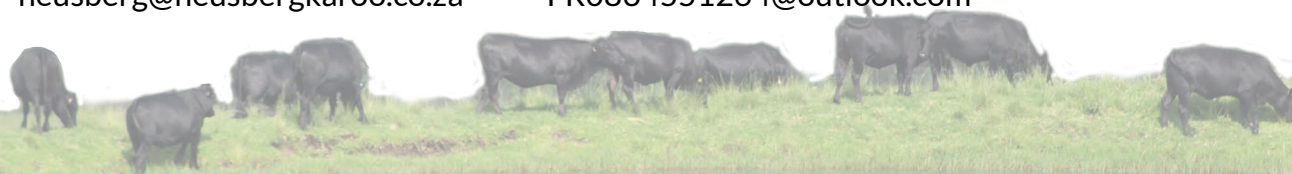
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
